





Daniel Belle Soloist

Daniel Belle made his professional debut at the Sydney Opera House in the Australian premiere of *Jerry Springer the Opera* and has since established himself as a versatile and in-demand performer across concert, theatre, and special events. From 2014 to 2016 he toured nationally and internationally with *Les Misérables*, covering Jean Valjean and performing the role over 100 times. He has since been invited to reprise Valjean in Christchurch, Hobart, and twice at Parramatta's Riverside Theatre. Other theatrical highlights include *My Fair Lady* (Opera Australia/GFO), Terry in *Side Show* (Hayes Theatre), and Lord Pinkleton in the national tour of Rodgers & Hammerstein's *Cinderella* (Opera Australia).

A long-standing member of the internationally acclaimed vocal group The Ten Tenors, Daniel has toured extensively throughout the United States, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, and most recently in Germany. He is a finalist for both the Rob Guest Endowment and the Joan Sutherland Scholarship, and has appeared at high-profile events including the arrival of Pope Benedict XVI in Sydney, International One-Day Cricket and A-League finals, the Australian Swimming Championships, Rugby Australia's Bledisloe Cup and Test Series matches – including the 2025 Wallabies vs. British & Irish Lions final – and the ABC-televised Australia Day Concert at the Sydney Opera House, where he performed *Nessun Dorma*. Daniel is delighted to return once again as guest soloist for QPAC's *Spirit of Christmas*.




Nina Korbe Soloist

Award-winning soprano Nina Korbe is fast emerging as one of Australia's most exciting young voices. Acclaimed for her creamy tone and expressive artistry, Nina is a graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium and London's Royal Academy of Music, both with distinction.

Her operatic highlights include making her professional debut as Maria in *West Side Story* with Opera Australia, Musetta in *La Bohème* with Opera Queensland, Tina in *Flight* with State Opera South Australia, and with Victorian Opera as Lisette in *La Rondine* and Young Heidi in *Follies*. Nina also maintains a busy concert schedule, performing with Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Southern Cross Soloists, Camerata – Queensland's Chamber Orchestra, Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra and internationally at the Musikverein with Queensland Youth Symphony.

As a proud Koa, Kuku Yalanji, Wakka Wakka woman, she is actively involved in the championing of Indigenous Voices; Nina sits on Queensland Symphony Orchestra's First Nations Advisory Board, the board of Playlab Theatre, is a board observer of Australian Women in Music and is the First Nations advisor to the Australian Music Foundation.



Christie Whelan Browne Host

Christie Whelan Browne is one of Australia's most versatile stage and screen performers – "a musical and cabaret talent not to be missed". Christie was most recently seen on screen in *Colin from Accounts* and her television credits across all major networks include *Spreadsheet*, *Mustangs FC*, *Neighbours*, *The Wrong Girl*, *Miss Fisher's Murder Mysteries* and *Offspring*. Christie also featured in popular mini-series *Peter Allen – Not the Boy Next Door* as Olivia Newton-John.

Christie has been delivering award-winning performances and delighting audiences since her iconic debut in *Grease – The Arena Spectacular*. Her indelible performances include roles in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, The Importance of Being Earnest,* and *The Drowsy Chaperone*. As a mainstay of Melbourne Theatre Company (MTC), Christie has performed in several productions including *Twelfth Night, An Ideal Husband* and *Born Yesterday*. In musical theatre, Christie has shown her triple-threat bona fides in many canonical works for all the major producers in Australia including defining roles in *Xanadu, Muriel's Wedding The Musical* and her award-winning turn in *Company*.

Christie is the star of four one-woman cabarets all of which debuted at the Adelaide Cabaret Festival and toured to great acclaim. She has been a popular return guest and performer on *Shaun Micallef's Mad as Hell, Carols by Candlelight* and *Spicks & Specks*; in 2023 she was a Grand Finalist on *Dancing with The Stars*.

In 2025 Christie stole her scenes as the antagonist in the MTC's production of Australian musical *Bloom* for Sydney Theatre Company and followed this as a co-star in the Australian Premiere of the Tony Award-Winning Musical *Kimberly Akimbo* for STCSA and MTC.



Waveney Yasso Soloist

Proud Yuwi Burra and South Sea Island descendant, Waveney calls Magandjin home. Waveney is a WAAPA graduate (Contemporary Music) with drums as her first instrument. After returning home, Waveney toured schools across Queensland showcasing her original children's music show Have You Ever Heard A Wombat Sing?. You might recognise Waveney from her work with Pub Choir. She has toured the world playing guitar and drumming with artists like Ben Lee, Paul Kelly, Powderfinger, Lior, Killing Heidi, The Cat Empire, The Grates, Ball Park Music and Meg Mac. As a composer Waveney has created original work across a range of genres for film, TV commercials and theatre work, and in 2023 received the MMMA Newcomer Award for her production work and original album titled Our Backyard. Waveney has been the face of ABC TV's We Are Australian campaign alongside Olivia Newton-John, Emma Wiggle and Human Nature. Waveney is dedicated to preserving language, songlines and history through art. When away from music she is actively working within communities to maintain culture, language and connection to Country.



Ellie Carragher Guest Artist

Scottish-born Ellie Carragher is known for her vocal strength, dynamic stage presence, and cheeky humour. She holds a Bachelor of Musical Theatre from the Queensland Academy of Excellence in Musical Theatre (QAEMT) and a Diploma of Musical Theatre from NIDA. Performance credits include U/S Dr Charlotte in *Falsettos* and Muriel Heslop in the 2022 NIDA DMT Showcase; at QAEMT, Alternate Carrie in Carrie: The Musical, Connie Mackenzie in A Chorus Line. Ellie loves ensemble work, making audiences laugh, and sharing her powerful voice.





Simon Kenway Musical Director / Conductor

Simon Kenway is an established and highly respected orchestral and operatic conductor. He has held posts as Principal Chorus Master of Opera Australia, Musical Director for *Opera in the Vineyards, Opera by George* and *Opera Under The Stars* in Broome, and Conductor and Chief Vocal Coach for the Sydney Conservatorium Opera School. He now works as a freelance conductor, both internationally and in Australia, and has been Artistic Director of Pacific Opera since 2015.

Simon has collaborated with many orchestras and opera companies including Sydney, Adelaide, Tasmanian, Adelaide, West Australian, Canberra and Queensland Symphony Orchestras, Opera Australia, West Australian Opera, State Opera of South Australia, Opera Queensland, as well as The Australian Ballet, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Sydney Philharmonic Choirs, Aldeburgh Productions in UK, the Australian Youth Orchestra, Beijing Symphony Orchestra, Willoughby Symphony Orchestra and many festivals.

Simon obtained a Bachelor of Music Degree (Piano) and a Post-Graduate Diploma (Opera) from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music. He then continued his post-graduate studies in Europe at the Royal College of Music in London and with Norman Del Mar, Gennady Rozhdestvensky, Pierre Boulez, Sir Simon Rattle and James Lockhardt. He also trained as a vocal coach with the leading repetiteurs from Covent Garden, English National Opera and Paris Opera. Simon returns this year to QPAC's *Spirit of Christmas* concerts, which he has been conducting each year since 2014.

Among its signature auditioned choirs is Brisbane Birralee Voices (BBV), an accomplished choral ensemble of young musicians from schools across Brisbane and the Gold Coast. Brisbane Birralee Voices meet weekly to sing, grow and build a welcoming, inclusive musical community. Auditioned from Years 7-12, these singers form the organisation's signature treble choir and explore music across a wide range of genres and styles.

In 2025, Brisbane Birralee Voices enjoyed an extraordinary year of performance opportunities, including premiering the score for Ballet Theatre Queensland's *Snow White*, performing with internationally acclaimed The Idea of North, and appearing in *The Chronicles* with the Stephanie Lake Company for Brisbane Festival. The year culminated in Voices of Birralee's 30th Anniversary Concert in QPAC's Concert Hall, and the choir is thrilled to be performing once again in *Spirit of Christmas*, produced by QPAC, as well as in Queensland Ballet's *The Nutcracker*, a wonderful finale to an exceptional year of music-making.

Brisbane Birralee Voices continues to inspire audiences through their artistry commitment, and joyful music-making, showcasing the remarkable talent of young singers in our community.

David Burton
Stage Director

Brisbane-based David Burton is an award-winning author and playwright. In 2014, he won the Text Prize for Children and Young Adults' Writing for his memoir How to be Happy, published in 2015. David is also known for his award-winning theatrical work including April's Fool, a verbatim play concerning illicit teenage drug use, published by Playlab Press. In 2016, his work St. Mary's in Exile premiered as part of Queensland Theatre Company's Main Stage season. He has written and directed Queensland Music Festival's signature community works, including The Power Within (2017, in partnership with the Isaac Regional Council) and The Mount Isa Blast (2019, in partnership with the Mount Isa City Council). David obtained his doctorate in 2021. He continues to write theatre-in-education touring pieces for the Grin and Tonic Theatre Troupe and has been involved in several projects with QPAC across 2025.



Timothy Sherlock Choral Director

Timothy Sherlock is an Australian choral and handbell conductor and composer. Having enjoyed a successful career in music education, Timothy now focuses his creative energies conducting several ensembles, composing choral and handbell music, presenting choral and music education workshops and adjudicating at eisteddfodau and music competitions around Australia. In addition to being the Choirmaster at QPAC, Timothy is the conductor of the Children's Health Queensland Community Choir and the Conductor/Musical Director of Cappella Chorale. From 2012 to 2015, Timothy was the co-director of the official choir convened by the Australian Government for the Dawn and Lone Pine services in Gallipoli, Turkey. He was the nominated Australasian massed-ringing conductor at the 17th and 18th International Handbell Symposia in Vancouver, Canada (2016) and Cairns (2018).



Bill Haycock Stage Designer

Graduating from NIDA in 1978, Bill has designed over 200 plays, ballets, dance pieces, operas, exhibitions, graphics and installations for many of the country's most innovative companies, directors and choreographers. Recent designs include the Playlab world premieres of Face to Face and Brutal Utopias, for Brisbane Festival's Unconditional, and for Ad Astra's Bakersfield Mist, A Life in the Theatre, Red and Of Mice and Men.
